To Amend Protected Health Information (PHI):

You can ask to correct Protected Health Information (PHI) that you believe is incorrect or incomplete. The Practice may deny your request, but will provide a written explanation.

Additional Rights for California Residents:

Under the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA), you have the right to know what personal information the Practice collects, request deletion, and opt out of the sale of your personal information (if applicable). The Practice does not sell personal information.

Additional Rights for Minors in California:

Minors who are 12 years of age and older have privacy rights for certain healthcare services as outlined by California law.
